ARCHITECTURE OLYMPIADS IN ASIA

Six hundred and fifty-eight tenth to twelfth grade students, **398** from Korea and **260** from Singapore, participated in the 4th International Architectural Olympiad in Asia. This confrontation of projects by high-school students is organised jointly by the UIA Member Sections in Korea and Singapore, along with Hanyang University in Korea (HYU) and the National University of Singapore (NUS).

One of Italo Calvino's 'Invisible cities': Sophronia, the thin city, was chosen as the inspiration for the models these young architects of tomorrow were asked to build. This session's grand prizes were awarded to Moon, Jeong-Im (Republic of Korea) and Liam Yuexin Jolene (Singapore). The projects will be on display at the University of Hanyang on 14 – 23 May 2009.

PRIME PROPERTY AWARD 2008

The second prize was awarded to the investors behind the Alsion Science and cultural centre in Sonderborg, 3XN Architects (Denmark). 'Westend Duo', complex in Frankfurt, designed by KSP Engel und Zimmermann Architekten (Germany) received third prize. The jury awarded a special prize to the Seewürfel ensemble in Zurich, designed by Camenzind Evolution architects (Switzerland).

Norwegian architect Sverre Fehn passed away in Oslo on 23 February 2008. At 34-years of age he designed his country's pavilion at the Brussels World's Fair in 1958. His professional career brought him international recognition culminating in the **1997 Pritzker Prize**. His work, inspired by the nature he respected and venerated, is punctuated with masterpieces that were acclaimed upon completion; the Norwegian **Iceberg Museum**, the **Hedmark Cathedral Museum** or the **Busk villa**. His last work, the **Norwegian Museum of Architecture in Oslo**, was inaugurated in 2007.
