:: Ireland records 8.1% improvement in energy efficiency levels

Sustainable Energy Ireland (SEI) has published the findings of a new report which details improvements in energy efficiency in Ireland over the ten year period 1995 -2005. The report finds that Ireland's energy efficiency improved over the decade. However, the level of improvement was reduced by the behavioural effects arising from socio-economic changes. The report, "Energy Efficiency in Ireland 2007" was produced by SEI's Energy Policy Statistical Support Unit (EPSSU) and is intended to inform energy efficiency policy in Ireland.

:: Commission report: conventional cooling drives up electricity demand



A new report from the Commission's Joint Research Center shows that the demand for energy in Europe is continuously increasing in spite of the actions intended to reduce demand. Total electricity consumption in the residential, tertiary and industrial sectors increased respectively by 10.8, 15.6 and 6.6% between 1999 and 2004 for the EU 25. The report highlights the role of air-conditioning systems

in the increase of electricity consumption, and the new shape of peak loads.

The objective of the EEBD action is to contribute to the take-off of the European Directive 2002/91/EC through preparation of a Web based dynamic vocational tool. This action covers the identification of the vocational training needs in the EU regions, the development of the training material and the development of an electronic tool that will provide a suitable way to obtain the technical competence

that allows for a better understanding and use of the Directive 2002/91/EC and relevant national regulations.

:: The BestFacade project has come to an end

Commercial buildings with integrated Double Skin Facades (DSF) can be energy efficient buildings, but not all DSF built in the last few years perform well. Far from it, in most cases large air conditioning systems have to compensate for summer overheating problems and the energy consumption significantly exceeds the intended heating energy savings.

Therefore, the **BestFacade project**, ending in December 2007, has aimed to create a best practice guideline to actively promote the energy efficient concepts of DSF. It is based on a comprehensive survey of DSF in Europe.

The outcomes of the BestFacade project are numerous:

- A project database of DSF in the EU;
- Best practice guidelines that provide common basic scientific, technical and economic knowledge supporting the design, choice, implementation and management of DSF;
- An assessment method that provides a good estimate of the thermal behaviour and the energy performance of the system which is harmonised with the currently developed CEN-standards for the implementation of the EPBD:
- **Benchmarks** that allow users and operators to compare their energy consumption levels with others in the same group, set future targets and identify measures to reduce energy consumption;
- Non-technological barriers and solutions to overcome them have been identified.

The dissemination strategy of the deliverables consists of a website, CD-Roms, workshops and presentations at conferences.

Eurima is about to publish a study undertaken by Ecofys: U-values for Better Energy Performance of Buildings. This study will be launched on 28th November 2007. The final reports from the Ecoheatcool project focus on The European Heat Market (Work package 1) and the European Cold Market (Work package 2). The Guidelines for assessing the efficiency of district heating and district cooling systems (Work package 3) explain the methodology for measuring the performance of district heating and cooling in buildings.

:: New IEA report on renewable heating and cooling



This timely report by the International Energy Agency examines the technologies, current markets and relative costs for heat and cold production using biomass, geothermal and solar-assisted systems. It highlights the role DHC systems can play to ensure the larger scale uptake of renewable energies and evaluates a range of national case studies and relevant policies. Should the successful and more costeffective policies be implemented by other countries, then the relatively untapped economic potential of renewable energy heating and cooling systems could be better realised, resulting in potential doubling of

the present market within the next few years.

:: The Display campaign celebrated its 4th birthday in Brussels



On 11th of October 2007 the "Display® Rendezvous" was held in Brussels. The event highlighted the achievements of the European Display® Campaign. In their speeches, Gordon Sutherland and Vincent Berrutto, both from the European Agency for Competitiveness and Innovation (EACI), highlighted the importance of this Campaign in facilitating certification markets. They particularly approved the strong

involvement of local authorities in the initial development and the current realisation of the Campaign.

At the end of the same day, the "Towards Class A" Awards were distributed during a ceremony, with the city of Lausanne winning the first prize.

To date, more than 6,800 buildings across Europe are involved.

:: The Concerted Action on the Implementation of the EPBD resumes work



After conclusion of the first Concerted Action (CA) on the EPBD last June 2007, Member States (MS) and the European Commission (EC) found that this work had been extremelly useful and that it should continue as MS carry out the field implementation of the EPBD up to 2009/10. After extensive

preparations, Concerted Action is resuming activities in December 2007, with a meeting of all MS and the EC in Warsaw.

This second phase of the CA will keep the same basic philosophy as CA1, and will mainly consist of discussions on specialized topics by experts from the participating MS to exchange ideas and address harmonization of methodologies and lessons learned.

The Warsaw meeting will also allow EU MS to get acquainted with certification and labelling procedures in use in the USA, one of the main focus of this meeting. Representatives of the USA RESNET will present their scheme, which has many similarities with the system that most EU MS are now implementing, offering many opportunities for useful exchange of experiences and methodologies.
